(b) In a village a tiger attacked cattle in a cattle shed. A woman noticed it and she was trying to drive it away by scare from the distance but it pounced on her, in the meanwhile her son shot the tiger dead. Examine the liability of her son under the Wildlife Protection Act.

(c) Government of Karnataka by passing a legislation banned the operation of saw mills in and around Western Ghats area. But then Mr. John had his saw mill in the prohibited area, was directed to close it. Mr. John questioned that it is violative of his fundamental right. Decide.
