 - b) The Plaintiff's and defendant's dog were fighting. The defendant was beating them in order to separate them, and the Plaintiff was looking. Defendant accidentally hit Plaintiff's eye causing severe injury. Is defendant liable for damage? Solve.
 - c) 'A' a keeper of fair price shop. At the time of scarcity of kerosene a long queue of customers is formed in front of his shop. This disturbs the business of neighbouring shop keepers. Can they take legal action against 'A'? Solve.
