 - (c) A merchant ship while leaving the territorial sea of State 'X' violates rules of State 'X'. Coast guards of State X signal the merchant ship to stop. Despite this the ship speeds out beyond the territorial sea of State 'X'. What immediate action can be taken by State 'X'? Advice.
